

GHANA

General Information

- The Republic of Ghana is a constitutional democracy, which had been colonized by the British.
- In 1957 it became the first African country to declare colonial rule (1957).
- Ghana is a multiethnic country with over 100 linguistic and ethnic groups totaling a population of over 24 million.
- Ghana is located in the western half of Africa, with the country of Ivory Coast in the west.
- The word “Ghana” means “Warrior King.”



Challenges

- The majority of the inhabiting population of Ghana is Christian at 71.2%; 28.3% are Pentecostal, 18.4% Protestant and 13.1% Catholic. The Muslims make the second largest religious minority at 17.6% (51% Sunni, 16% Ahmadiyya, and 8% Shia).
- 18% of 109 people groups unreached.
- In the villages, Islam and African traditional religions tend to hold sway.

Prayer

- Pray for the conversion and discipleship of a new generation of Christians who will make an impact in the religious, cultural, political and economic life of Ghana.
- For boldness for Christians in Ghana, to be faithful and persuasive in the midst of persecution.
